Chicago Symphony Ratifies Amended Agreement

On April 22, 2009, the musicians of the Chicago Symphony ratified an amended agreement with changed beginning July 1, 2009 and that has been extended an additional year to end on September 17, 2012. Beginning July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2011, the musicians agreed to a 2.5% reduction in salary for 24 months. The scale resumes at the previous level of \$2,665 per week on July 1, 2011 and in exchange for the temporary reductions, the CBA is extended one year with scales increasing by \$90 to \$2,755 per week on September 17, 2011 and by an additional \$30 per week to \$2,785 in March 2012. The reductions are projected to save approximately \$1.85 million.

The process was difficult, but the agreement was concluded in an atmosphere of mutual respect with the shared goal of maintaining the position of the Chicago Symphony Orchestra. Though there was spirited discussion, the orchestra overwhelmingly approved these changes.
