#### MOTIONS PASSED AT THE ICSOM CONFERENCE AUGUST 31 - SPETEMBER 2, 1971 SEATTLE, WASHINGTON

#### (Official Minutes to Follow)

- 1. The Minutes of the 1970 Conference were accepted, with the change of the ERF resolution, i.e., that the voluntary contribution was only to be discontinued for one year.
- 2. The Oregon Symphony Orchestra and the Winnipeg Symphony Orchestra were admitted into membership in ICSOM.
- 3. The treasurer's report was accepted.
- 4. The following By-Law changes were unanimously adopted (on behalf of the Vancouver, Winnipeg, Montreal delegates and Roy Cox, ICSOM treasurer (Toronto):
  - a. Under Article III, a new section to be inserted: "Each constituent member orchestra shall be assigned by the Executive Committee to one of the geographic regions of ICSOM." (Passed unanimously)
  - b. "The regions of ICSOM shall be designated as follows: Eastern, Central, Western, Southern, and Canadian."
  - c. Under Article IV, section 1: "The officers of ICSOM shall consist of Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Regional Vice-Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer, and Editor of Senza-Sordino.
  - d. Article IV, section 3 (c): to be rewritten to replace "Second Vice-Ghairman" with "Regional."
  - e. Article V -- First Vice-Chairman and Regional Vice-Chairman, Section 3: "It shall be the duty of each Regional Vice-Chairman to preside at all meetings of his region; he shall appoint all regional committees not otherwise provided for, and he shall be an ex-of-ficio member of all Regional committees. He shall call meetings of his constituent Regional Member Orchestras when necessary."

(The preceding By-Law changes were adopted in substance

with the understanding that counsel may find it necessary to revise some of the language.)

ſ. Article VIII -- Funds: Resolved: that whereas it is desirable that funds be available for presentation to various Canadian agencies; and whereas matters to be referred for legal advice may necessitate the retention of Canadian legal counsel; and whereas it has not been practical to deal with the specific problems of Canadian orchestras during the convention of the ICSOM, therefore be it resolved that, under Article VIII of the ICSOM By-Laws, a new section be added to read as "A Canadian Regional Account shall be created follows: and maintained by the remittance to the Regional Vice-Chairman of the Canadian Region of an amount equal to fifty percent of the dues paid by Canadian member orchestras to be utilized to advance the interests of the Canadian member orchestras in ICSOM. A semi-annual accounting in accordance with the requirements of Section 2 (b) of Article VIII shall be rendered to the Treasurer of ICSOM of income and expenses of such a (Passed unanimously)

(This resolution must be approved by two-thirds of the member orchestras.)

- 5. Irving Segal (Philadelphia) was nominated for Eastern Regional Vice-Chairman.
- 6. Henry Shaw (Cincinnati) was nominated for Central Regional Vice-Chairman.
- 7. Crawford Best (New Orleans) was nominated for Southern Regional Vice-Chairman.
- 8. James Weaver (Seattle) was nominated for Western Regional Vice-Chairman.
- 9. Robert Ryker (Montreal) was nominated for Canadian Regional Vice-Chairman.
- 10. Vance Beach (Los Angeles) was nominated for Editor of <u>Senza</u> <u>Sordino</u>.
- 11. Harry Barnoff (Cleveland) was nominated for ICSOM Treasurer.

The preceding nominees were elected by acclamation. The officers of ICSOM are as follows:

#### 12. ICSOM PROGRAM

### Recommendation #1

It was resolved that ICSOM set up a program to reach high school and college age students, the initial phase being the distribution of Senza Sordino, this being under the supervision of the Editor of Senza Sordino.

# Recommendation #2

It was resolved that a paper on symphony playing as a career be professionally prepared and be made available to the guidance counselors in music schools and college music departments and that this project be under the supervision of the First Vice-Chairman (the supposition being that money can be found for this project).

# Recommendation #3

It was resolved that a speaker's bureau be formed by each member orchestra to provide information and counseling to students who contemplate symphony playing as a career. Emphasis should be placed on solving those special problems of musicians from minority backgrounds. The was decided that this project be under the general supervision of the Secretary.

### Recommendation #4

The recommendation that a paper be professionally prepared analyzing the economics of the symphony orchestra and the symphony musician, giving a prognosis of the problems and offering a projection of what our society must do to meet the problems of the future was defeated.

# Recommendation #5

It was resolved that each orchestra establish a lobby to secure changes in the nickelodeon provisions of the copyright law, in that each orchestra establish a lobby to fight record piracy and the dumping of records from abroad.

### Recommendation #6

It was resolved that a sum of no more than \$1000 be allocated each year for secretarial services to be used by the Chairman's office.

## Recommendation #7

It was resolved that \$650 be allocated for the creation of an ICSOM Directory to be distributed to all ICSOM members.

# Recommendation #8

The recommendation that \$100 be allocated for the printing and distribution of ICSOM membership cards was defeated.

# Recommendation #9

It was resolved that a sub-committee be formed to consider and report to this Conference other group services that ICSOM should provide for the membership. This should include but not be limited to tax-sheltered annuities and group insurance. (Such a committee is already in existence.)

# Recommendation #10

It was resolved that the First Vice-Chairman of ICSOM shall maintain a complete and current file of the conductor evaluations made by all ICSOM orchestras and,

that the First Vice-Chairman shall secure from each orchestra a list of its conductors for the current season and,

that the First Vice-Chairman shall require from each orchestra a bi-monthly report which shall show those conductors on whom that orchestra has conducted evaluations and.

that the First Vice-Chairman shall publish to all orchestras, once every two months, a complete list showing the names of conductors each orchestra has evaluated that season and,

that each orchestra shall retain its own evaluations but shall make same available to any ICSOM orchestra committee on request.

### Recommendation #11

It was resolved that a sub-committee be formed to consider and report on ICSOM budget considerations. Its report should include but not be limited to selling advertisements and subscriptions to Senza Sordino, and selling the ICSOM Directory to individuals and organizations outside ICSOM. Its report should also include a projection of the specific funds needed from the AFM. (This subcommittee has already been formed.)

It was suggested that each ICSOM orchestra approach its Local with the idea of having the Local match the ICSOM dues in order to help fund ICSOM's activities and projects (page 5, ICSOM Program).

- 12. It was resolved that ICSOM petition the Federation and the Locals for financial support for the following activities and projects:
  - 1. Publication of Senza Sordino
  - 2. Contract and Rapid Communications Center
  - 3. Organizing of our Canadian orchestras
  - 4. Study on the economics of symphony orchestras and symphony musicians
  - 5. Paper on Symphony Playing as a Career
  - 6. Expenses of the ICSOM delegate to the AFM convention

The ICSOM program was accepted as amended.

- 13. It was resolved that the Recording Committee, along with the ICSOM Chairman and Secretary, shall, at the earliest convenient time, meet with President Davis and express to him the concern of this body over the lack of enforcement of Article 24, sections 3 and 6A, and request that his good offices immediately take steps to enforce such provisions as may be necessary to enforce these By-Laws, and also, at the same time, serve notice that if this is not done, the proper charges in each instance will be preferred against these AFM members.
- 14. The report of the Recording Committee was accepted.
- 15. It was resolved that for all contracts that are to be negotiated, whether they be recordings, cable TV, video cassettes, etc., not only the orchestras who participate be consulted, but all other ICSOM orchestras be represented.
- 16. It was resolved that rights in perpetuity be given to all players in all the new media -- closed-circuit TV, cable TV, video and disc cassettes, etc.
- 17. It was resolved that the Recording Committee explore the recording situation, have discussions with the Federation, and report back to ICSOM.
- 18. It was resolved unanimously to retain legal counsel on the same basis as before.
- 19. Buffalo, Cincinnati, and Montreal extended invitations to ICSOM for next year's Conference. The delegates voted to hold the 1972 ICSOM Conference in Montreal.
